Standards for Progress in the Major in Psychology:

In order to remain in the Major in Psychology, students must have achieved all of the following requirements by the time they have completed 75 hours:

- maintain a 2.00 or higher cumulative ISU grade point average (GPA);
- maintain a 2.20 or higher PSY Major GPA based on all required PSY courses taken at ISU; and
- earn a grade of C or better in PSY 111, 138, 200, and 231; MAT 120 and 145, and a lab science course.
