Applicants admitted with a specialist degree in school psychology or a master’s degree may be assessed course credit up to a maximum of 60 credits towards the doctoral program’s graduate curriculum. Admission with advanced graduate status is determined on an individual basis after the School Psychology Coordinating Committee reviews the applicant’s transcript(s). With 60 credits, applicants would begin the doctoral program in the third year of graduate study. With advanced graduate status, it would take three years to complete the degree with two years of coursework and a 12-month internship. Advanced students must also defend their doctoral dissertation.
